## B. COURSES PREPARED AND CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT

## COURSES PREPARED AND COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

- Arts 2361 Foundations in Photography I  
This course introduces basic concepts in photography through lecture, readings and studio practice in traditional and digital processes.
- Arts 3367 Intermediate Digital Photography  
This course builds and expands upon the digital and analogue concepts and techniques covered in Introduction to Digital Photography and Foundations II.

- Arts 4360      Readings in Photography  
In this intensive writing course, students will read, write, and create studio projects in reaction to historical and contemporary written accounts of the history, practice, and interpretation of photography.
- Arts 4366      Thesis I Seminar  
This course is a senior-level course for photography majors requiring a series of related photographs. This course is the first half of the senior thesis.
- Arts 4367      Thesis II Seminar  
The course is the second half of the Senior Thesis for photography majors requiring a series of original photographs to be documented in a written creative statement. An exhibition in the gallery of some or all of the work culminates the senior thesis.
- Arts 4368      Photography Special Problems  
An advanced level, independent study in photography which requires students to pursue a personal conceptual direction and to develop the appropriate technical and critical skills necessary for creating a cohesive body of artwork. May be repeated with different emphasis for additional credit.

## CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT

### BFA, Photography Degree Program Changes

The photography faculty evaluated and overhauled the degree program to allow students to graduate in 4 years. Restructuring of the program entailed a 12-cr semester to a 15-cr semester, pre-requisite course changes, and elective adjustments that created pathways within our school, the college (BFA Theatre/Film production program), and an open university elective option.

### Core I & Core II (Courses)

I chaired the Foundations Curriculum Committee in 2018 – 2019 which was tasked to collaborate and develop two new courses for our foundations area to be taught Fall 2020. The committee and I wrote new curriculum for the School of Art & Design fostering interdisciplinary research, writing, and making to include both ideas and formal aspects unique to each area of discipline within the School of Art & Design. It was approved in 2019.

Developed in tandem with the School of Art &amp; Design's new Core I &amp; Core II foundations courses, these courses introduce field research, professional practices, artistic development, visual literacy, critical and analytical inquiry, image sequencing, and bookmaking to serve as equivalents across the disciplines within the School of Art &amp; Design.</p>
Arts 4361	<p>The Photographic Project</p> <p>I collaborated with my Photography colleagues in the development of one additional course in the Photography Program. This course has students define, research, and create extended photographic projects focused on a single theme. Students explore various methodologies to conceptualize, execute, and evaluate a series of related photographs, based on a broad theme suggested by the instructor, such as identity, politics, place, or social media. In addition, students choose a field of inquiry within that theme to create works to be installed in a professional setting.</p>
2017 Arts 3367	<p>Large Format Photography</p> <p>This course builds upon the digital and analogue concepts and techniques covered in Introduction to Digital Photography and Foundations II. I introduced new curriculum using large-format field cameras, advanced darkroom film and print refinement skills, advanced mechanics of a large-format camera, high resolution wet mount digital scanning, photoshop, and large format printing.</p>
2016 BFA Photo Degree	<p><i>Photography Portfolio Reviews</i></p> <p>Created in 2016 by the photography faculty, we established <i>Photography Portfolio Review</i> sessions held one day each semester for photography majors currently enrolled in Intro to Digital Photography. It is a non-binding 15-minute conversation with majors and full-time faculty in the program. It consists of a written statement and printed photographic work representing their time in our BFA Photography Program. The goal is to foster community engagement and dialogue, provide individualized support sessions, and address future professional development pathways.</p>
