D. Courses Prepared and Curriculum Development:

RC 1313 Introduction to Respiratory Care: This introductory course to the field of Respiratory Care is designed to acquaint the student with responsibilities of the Respiratory Care Practitioner as a member of the healthcare team.

RC 1315 Basic Technology in Respiratory Care: Designed to teach students basic principles of respiratory care techniques and basic operations of equipment. Artificial ventilation, cardiopulmonary resuscitation and chest physiotherapy will be covered.

RC 1445 Respiratory Care Clinical Lab II: Direct patient care is performed under close supervision in a non-critical setting. Routine procedures are performed, including delivery of aerosolized medications, oxygen therapy, incentive spirometry, postural drainage, and chest percussion

RC 2213 Introduction to Respiratory Care: This course offers an in-depth overview of the respiratory care profession to acquaint the student with the responsibilities of the respiratory therapist as part of healthcare team. Progression of the profession, career opportunities, past and future impact of profession on patient recovery and health maintenance, and medical gas therapy will be covered.

RC 3316 Foundations in Respiratory Care: This course provides a study of theories and modalities utilized in delivering, monitoring, and evaluating basic respiratory therapeutics to patients with compromised respiratory function in various healthcare settings. Aspects of artificial ventilation, arterial blood gas analysis, lung volume diagnostics, and hyperinflation intervention will be covered in patient scenarios.

RC 2355 Respiratory Care Practice I: Student gains skill in clinical procedures, interactions with patients and professional personnel as he practices, under supervision, respiratory care therapeutic modalities in a healthcare setting. Becomes familiar with various RT aspects of patient care as presented in medical/surgical and pediatric clinical situations.

RC 2365 Respiratory Care Clinical Practice II / Adult ICU: Students will perform respiratory therapy procedures in a healthcare institution under the supervision of a Respiratory Therapist. Preparatory instruction is provided for mechanical ventilation and other primary critical care procedures.

RC 2375 Clinical Practice III / Adult/Neo-Pedi ICU: A supervised clinical education experience in which the student organizes and administers advanced respiratory therapeutics on assigned patients in adult, neonatal, and pediatric critical care. Diagnostic procedures, including arterial blood gas procurement and measurement, bedside physiologic monitoring, airway care, basic pulmonary function testing, as well as monitoring and maintenance of ventilator parameters are performed.

RC 3316. Fundamentals of Respiratory Care: This course provides a study of theories and modalities utilized in delivering, monitoring, and evaluating basic respiratory therapeutics to patients with compromised respiratory function in various healthcare settings. Aspects of artificial ventilation, arterial blood gas analysis, lung volume diagnostics, and hyperinflation intervention will be covered in patient scenarios.

RC 3310 Cardiopulmonary/Renal Gross Anatomy: Designed to acquaint the student with the anatomy and physiology of the cardiovascular, pulmonary, and renal systems. Students will participate in the cadaver dissection and radiographic anatomy by matching cadaver cardiopulmonary structures with radiographic findings. Prerequisites: BIO 2430 and RC 2352.

RC 3311 Applied Pathology: Lecture series and case presentation related to pathophysiology, etiology, symptoms, diagnosis and treatment of selected pulmonary disease entities, cardiac diseases, neurologic disease processes and occupationally acquired disease entities as they relate to respiratory

function. Clinical Simulation software utilized for clinical patient assessment, diagnostic data gathering and treatment. (WI)

RC 3331 Advanced Respiratory Therapy Instrumentation: A comprehensive focus on advanced equipment and rehabilitation technology utilized in the critical care, homecare, pulmonary rehabilitation and blood gas lab settings. Lectures and class activities will detail hardware for hemodynamic monitoring, supplemental oxygen administration, noninvasive monitoring, blood gas measurement, quality control, quality assurance and various other support advances in healthcare.

RC 3352 Advanced Ventilator Concepts: In-depth study of specific ventilators used in adult, pediatric and neonatal ventilation to include ventilator classification, method of operation, parameter interrelationships and ventilator patient monitoring. Lectures and class activities will focus on ventilator analysis of several contemporary volume, time, pressure, and flow-cycled ventilators.

RC 3365 Respiratory Care Practice IV: Advanced clinical education in the intensive care setting in which the student monitors and administers critical care therapeutics on assigned patients in the adult and neonatal intensive care setting. Physician input and pulmonary rounds assist students in theory and application of care for the critically ill patient.

RC 3375 ICU Internship: Through affiliations with agencies, hospitals and selected treatment centers the student interns in the intensive care setting by monitoring and administering critical care therapeutics. Analysis and clinical application of advanced ventilator care of patients is emphasized along with patient care diagnostics and management in the ICU.

RC 3411 Applied Pathology/Gross Anatomy: Class lectures on pathophysiology and therapeutics concerning pulmonary, cardiac, and thoracic diseases/disorders to include obstructive and restrictive diseases, airway abnormalities, infectious diseases and lung cancer. An associated gross anatomy laboratory with emphasis on cardiopulmonary anatomy, both pathologic and nonpathologic is included for student application.

RC 4318 Independent Study: This course provides the student an in-depth study on a topic or health-care problem impacting respiratory care. The course may be repeated for credit with a different emphasis.

RC 4324 Sleep Medicine and Polysomnography: This course introduces the respiratory care student to sleep medicine and polysomnography. The course will present topics on sleep stages, sleep architecture, and sleep disorders. Basic and advanced treatment options of selected sleep disorders will be discussed. Prerequisite: Instructor approval.

RC 4350 Respiratory Care Research: An introduction to research methods, experimental inquiry, and naturalistic observations. This course is designed to acquaint the student with the necessary skills to conduct research in respiratory care. The primary purpose is to provide a foundation from which the student will critique, develop, and apply multiple research strategies. Prerequisite: HP 3302 or equivalent.

RC 5211 Polysomnography Instrumentation I: Designed to teach the function, operation, and design of electroneurodiagnostic equipment. Monitoring devices, electrode application, and patient connection will be covered in detail. Prerequisite: Departmental approval.

RC 5214 Polysomnography Instrumentation II: Advanced study of waveform characteristics and montage development, filters, and PSG electronics. Signal pathways, reference electrodes, impedance checking and filter settings in calibration waves will be covered. Prerequisite: Departmental approval.

RC 5302 Clinical Practice Guidelines and Respiratory Care Protocols: An examination of the roles of clinical practice guidelines and protocols in the continuum of patient care. Analysis of the development, modification, initiation, and evaluation of patient outcomes will be covered. Barriers to protocol practice and strategies for implementation will be explored. Evidence-based outcomes will be summarized through literature reviews.

RC 5306 Academic Leadership in Respiratory Care: Introduction to the foundations necessary to build a strong understanding of academic administration, fiscal planning, curriculum development, and outcomes assessment for respiratory therapist programs. Topics include preparation of annual accreditation reports, organization of clinical practice rotations, the role of advisory committees, and integration of didactic, laboratory, and clinical experiences.

RC 5310 Fundamentals of Polysomnography: Introduction to the physiology of sleep, including sleep neurology, sleep architecture, and classification of sleep disorders. Review of basic cardiac physiology and ECG arrhythmia recognition. Sleep pathologies will be discussed according to etiology, pathophysiology, symptoms, diagnosis, treatment, and prognosis. Prerequisite: Departmental approval.

RC 5313 Polysomnography Therapeutic Intervention: In-depth study of the treatments available for sleep apnea including, CPAP, BiPAP, oxygen therapy, patient adjunctive fitting, surgical intervention, and the role of the sleep tech in titration. Special attention will be given to titration algorithms, nocturnal seizure disorder studies, REM behavior disorder studies, MSLT's, and MTW's. Prerequisite: Departmental approval.

RC 5412 Clinical Polysom-Sleep Staging I: Direct patient diagnostic monitoring is performed under close supervision in a sleep lab. Differential amplifiers, amplifier calibration, artifact correction, and the professional role of the sleep tech will be demonstrated. Prerequisite: Departmental approval.

RC 5415 Clinical Polysom-Sleep Staging II: Advanced clinical education in sleep staging rules, light, delta, and REM sleep scoring and analysis. EEG, EMG, ECG, and respiratory events will be discussed in-depth and other components of the polysomnogram report. Prerequisite: Departmental approval.
