B. Courses Taught

ARTF 1301 2D Design

This course serves as an introduction to the elements and principles of design through the use of a variety of two-dimensional media and techniques. The course is structured around topical lectures, technical demonstrations, a sequence of creative projects, and group critiques.

ARTF 132 Basic Drawing

This course is an introduction to a variety of media and techniques and an exploration of descriptive and expressive possibilities in observational drawing. The course is structured around topical lectures, technical demonstrations, in-class drawing exercises, and a sequence of extended out-of-class drawings.

ART 1301 Core I: Collaboration

This course, along with its companion course Core II, serves as an introduction to the School of Art and Design. Taken by all incoming students in the school, this hands-on course introduces foundational concepts relevant to the fields of design, studio art, photography, art history and art education, with an emphasis on peer collaboration.

ART 1302 Core II: Archive

This course, along with its companion course Core I, serves as an introduction to the School of Art and Design. Taken by all incoming students in the school, this hands-on course introduces foundational concepts relevant to the fields of design, studio art, photography, art history and art education, with an emphasis on research and archiving practices.

ARTS 1301 Studio I

This course, along with its companion course Studio II, serves as an introduction to the Studio Art program and is taken by students entering this program. Studio I places emphasis on drawing as a foundational perceptual and technical skill via a sequence of short and long-form creative projects.

ARTS 2322 Queer Art and Visual Culture

This course explores the contributions to visual culture by queer (LGBTQIA+) artists and designers, highlighting the history of queer art through the present day, and examining the diverse, often cross-disciplinary manifestations of queer art and design in contemporary culture.

ARTS 3322 Drawing II

This course investigates a variety of drawing media and subjects, with an emphasis on experimentation, alternative media, conceptual development, and individual expression. The course is structured around topical lectures, in-class drawing exercises, and a sequence of extended out-of-class drawings.

ARTS 4308I Disegno a Firenze: Drawing in Florence

This course is an observational drawing class based in Florence, Italy. Students engage in on-site observational drawing at 20+ historic and significant cultural sites in Florence over the course of four weeks. This courses pairs with the History of Italian Art course taught in tandem.

These courses were launched in fall 2020.
