PH 3374 Global Health (asynchronous - online; Spring 2025)

Students were able to learn material about global health disparities related to global health transitions and priorities, social determinants of health, global health financing and implementation, infectious diseases, reproductive health concerns and nutritional deficiencies. Additionally, students were able to learn about noncommunicable diseases, mental health promotion, injury prevention, and promoting healthy living across various lifespans. Assignments consisted of quizzes, discussion board posts, and interactive activities related to global health financing, infectious diseases impact on global health, and impacts of noncommunicable diseases. Also, students were required to submit a brief reflection paper analyzing the connection between global health disparities and policies and interventions.

PH 5374 Global Public Health (asynchronous - online; Spring 2025)

Students were able to learn material about global health disparities related to global health transitions and priorities, social determinants of health, global health financing and implementation, infectious diseases, reproductive health concerns and nutritional deficiencies. Additionally, students were able to learn about noncommunicable diseases, mental health promotion, injury prevention, and promoting healthy living across various lifespans. Assignments consisted of quizzes and interactive activities related to levels of prevention to address maternal health concerns and impacts of noncommunicable diseases. Additionally,

students were required to answer discussion board posts regarding globalization impact on health, explanation of social determinants of health and the levels of prevention, financial support and revenue for addressing health disparities, application of PRECEDE-PROCEED, and global health disparities related to mental health and injuries. Also, students were required to evaluate previous intervention strategies using Intervention Mapping.

PH 5303 Social Determinants of Health (asynchronous - online; Fall 2023)

Students were able to complete assignments through learning about disparities that impact marginalized communities by closely examining the Social Determinants of Health and selected a population of interest and health issue to address in their final project. Students wrote about historical and current disparities related to the Social Determinants of Health that were endured by their population of interest living with a specific health condition. Additional final project tasks consisted of incorporating the Socioecological Model to further examine the contributors and effects of their population of interest' disparities and implementing suggestions using effective public health strategies such as cultural competency and intersectionality.
